Letter from the Principal

Dear Parents and Guardians:

Happy New Year! This year has gone by so quickly; it is hard to believe that it is 2013. We have had a number of changes this year, which have been positive ones. The **uniform policy** is now in place after some positive revisions and appears to be working quite well. Many teachers have expressed observing a positive change in the culture at Reed High School. The **fence** seems to be working well; we have been able to lock down the facility the weekend of December 1 to protect many WCSD busses due to possible flooding at the bus garage. We have two **campus monitors** assisting with crossing Baring Blvd. before, during, and after school. We are looking for volunteers who might assist if one of the Campus Monitors is sick or needs to cover in-school suspension. Please call Brandon Bringham, Assistant Principal (325-8302) if you are interested in **volunteering**.

Two of the goals of the Washoe County School District and its high schools are to increase the **graduation rate** and prepare our graduates for the challenges of **life after high school**. Increasing the graduation rate will take the combined efforts of administrators, counselors, teachers, students, and parents.

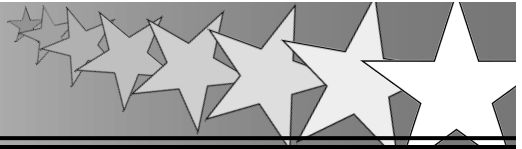
I am pleased to announce that Reed High School received \$69,539 in **Intervention Funds** to assist with credit recovery efforts so that all seniors have the opportunity to graduate. What this will take is a concerted effort on the part of students and parents to take advantage of these programs.

- ◇ Currently seven teachers, Kristina Gonzalez (coordinator and elective classes), Peggy Stover (HQ English), Cathy Morgan (HQ Social Studies), Wendy Houghton (HQ Math), Tim Powers (HQ Science), and Michelle Rutherford

(HQ Science) are acting as **mentors** to students enrolled in **A+** which is a certified **credit recovery** computer based program. What was discovered is that many students need a mentor to monitor their progress and administer their tests. Our guidance department has been talking with seniors primarily, but also underclass students who are credit deficient, to enroll in credit recovery classes. If you have any questions on your student's status, please call your child's counselor.

- ◇ **Computer Lab 501** will be open and staffed by Tom Hadlock, (HQ English & Social Studies), from 2:45-4:15 p.m. on Tuesdays and Thursdays to assist and provide opportunity for any student working on **A+**, **Plato**, or **computer use** for a class project.
- ◇ An additional **Plato lab** staffed by Lianne Whitley (HQ Math) has begun to give more students the opportunity to enroll in Plato classes outside the school day for credit recovery purposes.
- ◇ An **after-school tutoring program** staffed by Wendy Houghton (HQ Math) and Kelly Coleman (HQ Science) is available in the **library** Mondays, Tuesdays, and Thursdays from 2:45-4:15 p.m. for any students who may need additional help with assignments and homework. Parents may be contacted by their child's teacher(s) that after-school tutoring is being assigned due to incomplete homework.
- ◇ With the **High School Proficiency Examinations** scheduled for the first week in March, money has been designated for **HSPE Review**. **February 2, 9, 16, and 23** are scheduled for HSPE in Writing and Math. Terry DeBarger (HQ English teacher) will teach writing

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instruction from 9:00-9:50 a.m. focusing on essays. Soon after, students will see Brad Naughton (HQ Math) and Michelle Keely (HQ Special Education Math) for HSPE math concepts between 10:00-11:45 p.m. Lunch will be provided from 11:45-12:15 p.m. After lunch, writing students will return to Mr. DeBarger for essay correction and have a discussion on good writing techniques.

- ◇ After school during the month of February, members Bill Richards, Genevieve Morehouse, Tim Powers, John Lott, Kathleen Styne, Dean Pereos, Michelle Rutherford, Leigh Metcalfe, and Jeff Schwiesow (all Highly Qualified science teachers) of the **Science Department** will offer **HSPE review** in all science areas covered by the test.
- ◇ Peggy Stover (HQ English and Reading Specialist) will offer **HSPE review** for the **reading test**.
- ◇ **Plato Summer School & HSPE remediation** for the July test taught by Matt Norbeck (HQ Alternative Education) will be offered (AT NO CHARGE) to seniors who need to recover credits for summer graduation.

The plan is in place, the **teachers** are **dedicated** and **committed**, and now are ready to **assist** any **senior** or **junior** who wants to take advantage of a program that will help them participate in graduation activities.

Reed High School was informed that **graduation** is on **Thursday, June 6**, at **12:00 noon** at **Lawlor Events Center**. **No, the time is not a mistake.**

Our graduates are scheduled for practice at 10:00-11:15 that same morning. Reed High School will provide food for seniors between practice and graduation.

As second semester fast approaches, I recommend that your student and you schedule a time to check **Infinite Campus** weekly and e-mail teachers if you have any questions.

I encourage your sons and daughters to take the **ACT** and **SAT** tests for college. According to ACTIVITY, a publication of the College Board, "The ACT score results once again show a strong relationship between high school course taking and college and career readiness. Students who took the recommended minimum core curriculum in high school, four years of English and three years each of mathematics, science, and social studies were much more likely than those who took less than the core requirements to meet or surpass the ACT College Readiness Benchmarks in each subject area. Students who took additional courses beyond the core curriculum were even more likely to achieve the benchmark scores." The article continues "We can't stress enough how important high school course selection is in the college and career readiness process. It's very clear that students who take the right courses are much more likely to be ready for success after high school than those who don't."

In February, current 9th, 10th and 11th grade students will receive their course offering guide for the **2013-2014** school year. The **course offering guide** may be on-line or in print, we are currently discussing this at the district level.

Please take the time to review this curriculum guide with your child to determine course selection for the next school year. Please consider both Advanced Placement and Honor classes as part of their schedule.



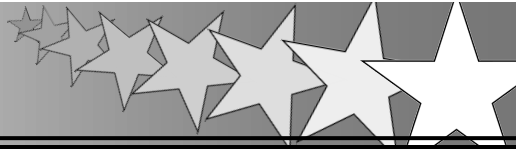
Congratulations Corner

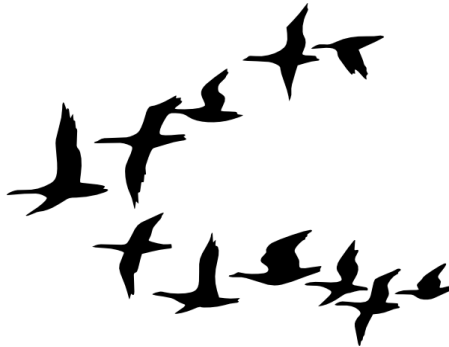

FRIENDLY REMINDER.....

The **High School Proficiency Exams (HSPE)** will be administered in March. The HSPE will be given to sophomores, juniors, and seniors who still need to earn a passing score. Keep in mind that these 4 tests (Reading, Math, Science, & Writing) are **REQUIRED** for **graduation** from any Washoe County High School, and your child's attendance and preparation are **MANDATORY**.

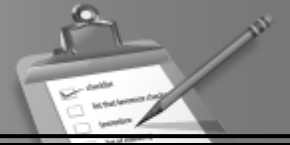

We had 47 freshmen who earned all "A"s on their first progress grades. We appreciate their hard work and as a reward they received 5 **off-campus coupons** to use at lunch. I would also like to remind all freshmen that they will not automatically get off campus privileges when they are sophomores. Students need to **earn at least 5 credits** their freshman year in order to have off campus privileges at lunch as a sophomore. 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ATTENDANCE

As we approach the end of the semester there are always concerns that arise in relation to school attendance. Please note, the Washoe County School District policy with respect to attendance states that all students are required to attend school for a minimum of 90% of the scheduled classes in order to receive credit. The policy applies even if the student is passing their classes academically. **In other words, it is possible to pass a class academically and still fail the course due to lack of attendance.**

Fortunately, not all of the absences count against students. For instance, if your child misses school for a medical reason (MED), a doctor excused day (EMD), a school business day (SCH), or a circumstantial day (CIR) then those days are not counted into the total. Therefore, at Reed High School, 90% attendance translates to (6) unverified absences per semester.

The absence types that do count toward the six unverified are absent unknown (AUK), domestic (DOM), truant (TRU) and confirmed truant (CT). If your child has accumulated seven or more absences in any combination of these absence types, please contact the attendance office as soon as possible. Also, if your child does miss school, please make sure you send a note or make a phone call into the attendance office (325-8337) within three days of the absence.

TARDIES

Punctuality makes for fewer interruptions to learning and is one of the traits employers value most. We have worked diligently to reward punctuality and discourage tardiness this year at Reed High School.

Results have been positive and demonstrate improvement over years past. There are many students who are rarely or never late. These students can look forward to receiving H.O.T. Passes (as long as they don't have unexcused absences), which can be used to get out of detention or turned in at the end of the year for a chance at raffle prizes. There are those few, however, who are frequently or chronically tardy to school and class, which can be disruptive to the teaching and learning environment already taking place.

We encourage you to review your child's attendance on **Infinite Campus**. Tardies are indicated by UMI (Unexcused Missed Instruction). The vast majority of tardies occur in the morning. If a problem is apparent, please impress upon your child the importance of punctuality and help him or her make a plan for arriving to school and class on time. Furthermore, please look over your son or daughter's attendance portion of the **Grade Monitoring Sheet** that is assigned to be brought home and signed by you every fourth week of school.



REED HIGH SCHOOL CLOSED OVER HOLIDAY BREAK

VOLUNTEER COMMITMENT AND PROCEDURES
READ THE FOLLOWING CAREFULLY BEFORE SIGNING AND DATING THIS APPLICATION

Screening: For the safety of students, all prospective volunteers will be asked to complete an Adult School Volunteer Application and provide a photo I.D. (international ID's are accepted). All prospective volunteers will be given a "Background Check" check pursuant to NRS 179D. Additionally, the District, in its discretion and without a statement of reason, may require a complete criminal history check on any volunteer at any time. In programs where a volunteer is an Overnight Chaperone and may work alone for extended periods of time with a student or by request from the principal, fingerprinting and a full state and federal background check are required. If fingerprinting is required, the school district will cover these costs. All fingerprinting must be authorized.

Confidentiality: What you hear and observe about students, families, and staff while volunteering in a school is **confidential**. Repeating a seemingly harmless comment can lead to misunderstandings and hurt feelings. For schools to provide the best environment for learning, everyone's privacy must be respected.

Liability: The Washoe County School District is proud to provide liability coverage and an accident policy for its volunteers, which will provide up to \$1,500 after any other valid and collectable insurance. In order to have this protection, **all volunteers must sign in on the school's volunteer / visitor sign in sheet** (in every school office) every time they volunteer. Volunteers are not covered by Workers' Compensation.

Child neglect and abuse reporting: School volunteers are obligated under mandatory child reporting laws to report any suspected child neglect or abuse. Please refer to Washoe County School District mandatory reporting guidelines.

Supervision: Volunteers perform under the direction and supervision of school personnel. Volunteers should know and follow school policies and rules. The District, in its discretion and without a statement of reasons, may suspend any volunteer from further volunteer activities pending any background check. No statement by the District establishes a property right to perform volunteer work.

Communication: If you are unable to make it to school when you are expected, please call the school and leave a message. Similarly, school staff will contact you if your time is cancelled or changed for any unforeseen reason. You may contact the WCSD Volunteer Services Office at 775-851-5655, or email llightfoot@washoe.k12.nv.us with questions or for assistance.

Student / Volunteer relationships: Volunteers function in a position of trust and Washoe County School District does not extend that volunteer / student trust relationship outside of the supervised school environment. It is the responsibility of the volunteer to notify the site administrator immediately if he/she becomes involved with a student / family outside the WCSD environment.

ATHLETICS

It has been an outstanding fall campaign for Reed Athletics. As we get set to tip-off with Winter sports we would like to thank and congratulate all of our outstanding athletes and coaches who have made the Fall sports season a memorable one. Please check our year end issue for all of the team and individual awards amassed by Raider athletes and coaches for the 2012-13 school year.

Boys/Girls Cross Country: We had three runners qualify for state and represent Reed very well. Brandon Robbins and Kelsea Campbell made their first trip to the state meet and Cody Forman continued his outstanding career with a 7th place finish in Las Vegas.

Girls Golf: For the Lady Raiders, this would be considered a year to gain experience as we had a very young team. We sent four young ladies to the Regional tournament and the future looks bright as we return a host of experienced golfers for next year. (5th Place High Desert League)

Girls Soccer: Another very young team was able to close out the regular season as the third place finisher on the High Desert side. A scrappy and tough playoff loss shows that the future is bright for this program and a large number of experienced players will return in 2013. (3rd Place High Desert League-Regional quarterfinalist)

Boys Soccer: First year head coach Joel Martinez has this program going in the right direction. The Raiders proved a tough out all year, just missing the playoffs and setting the stage for a run to the Regionals next year. (5th Place High Desert League)

Volleyball: As one of the top teams in the state a year ago, the Lady Raiders proved their success was no fluke as they rolled to a second place finish in the High Desert League and the Regional semi-finals. Reed will look to reload for next year's campaign with an influx of new talent and

some of the best players in the region returning. (2nd Place High Desert League-Regional semi-finalist)

Boys/Girls Tennis: Both programs again returned to the Regional tournament and again proved they belong. Reed had record numbers of players out this year and more is expected next year with both these teams being a year wiser and stronger. (Girls: 3rd place High Desert League-Regional quarterfinalist. Boys: 3rd place High Desert League, Regional quarterfinalist)

Football: Reed continued its dominance in the Northern Region by hoisting its third Regional crown in four years. The Raiders swept the High Desert League and again met nationally ranked Bishop Gorman in the state semi-finals. Reed put up an outstanding fight before bowing out to the eventual state champs. Reed looks to reload in 2013 for another playoff run. (1st Place High Desert League, Regional Champions, state semi-finalist)

Mayor's Cup: Reed and Spanish Springs have renewed their annual competition now in its second year. Reed dominated the cup a year ago and as Winter sports get set to go, Reed again has the lead... by the slimmest of margins; 20-19.

Baseball: The Reed Athletic program is pleased to announce that the man who built Reed into a Regional power is back. Reed welcomes Head Coach John Phenix back to the program he built as we head into the 2013 baseball season. Reed is very excited to have Coach Phenix back.

Reed Athletics: As Reed gets older, Reed Athletics continues to move in new directions to help maintain and improve our facilities. The first annual **Reed Athletics Poker Tourney** was a great success as we raised nearly \$5,000.00 dollars to help with our facilities. The Athletic Department is very pleased to announce that Assistant Principal Kevin Taylor won the final table and in the spirit of the holidays donated the grand prize

back to the Reed Athletic Department. Thank you Dr. Taylor and all that made this event such a huge success!

We are also pleased to announce that Reed again will be selling **Christmas trees** to raise money for the eventual rehabbing of our Football/Soccer field. We will update you in the next newsletter as to how successful this fundraiser was.

Reed Athletics began its first year as the chief operator of the **snack bars**. 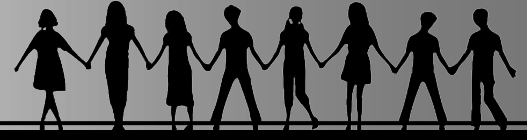
Our nationally ranked Varsity Air Rifle Team is rapidly preparing for another successful year and is expecting to qualify for Nationals.

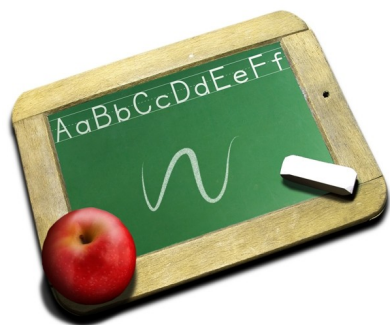

In their 2nd year (depending on each volunteer's commitment), School Garden Coordinators assist in providing training to their parent volunteer successors.*
- *School Garden Coordinators at the high school level will be responsible for planting and maintaining the garden with students. They will also work with teachers to further develop and integrate current classroom curriculum in the garden. They are responsible for weekly emails and communication between the School Garden Committee members, the school and the community, Garden scheduling, event planning and the School Garden Committee meetings will also be the responsibility of these positions. Coordinators will represent the Garden Habitat at PTO meetings and other necessary community forums.*

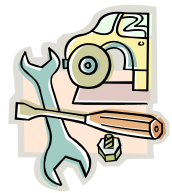
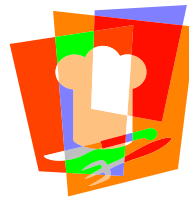

ATTENTION SENIORS: It's time to apply for financial aid! See the following for important information regarding the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and a step-by-step guide to completing the application.

WHAT IS FINANCIAL AID?

While most colleges expect you and your family to contribute financially toward your education, financial aid can help narrow the gap between your resources and the cost of attendance. To apply for federal financial aid, you must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Applications are available starting January 1st of a student's senior year.

Federal Financial aid includes the following:

- **Grants** = money you don't have to repay; usually based on financial need.
 - **Federal Grant Programs:** Federal Pell Grant; Academic Competitiveness Grant (ACG); National Science and Mathematics Access to Retain Talent (SMART) Grant; Teacher Education Assistance for College and Higher Education (TEACH) Grant; Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (FSEOG)
- **Loans** = borrowed money that you must pay back, usually with interest.
 - **Federal Loan Programs:** Federal Perkins Loan Program; Stafford Loans (borrowed by students); PLUS Loans (borrowed by parents and graduate students)
- **Federal Work-study** = money you earn through certain jobs on or off campus to help you pay for your education.

TERMS TO KNOW

- **Assets** = an item of value, such as real estate, stocks, bonds, etc.
- **Cost of Attendance (COA)** = the total cost of college for one year; includes tuition, fees, books, supplies, transportation, food, housing, personal expenses, etc.
- **Expected Family Contribution (EFC)** = amount a family can reasonably be expected to contribute, but not what the family will pay to the college; calculated using information included in the FAFSA; two components are considered: parent contribution and student contribution.
- **Financial Aid Offer / Financial Aid Package** = the total amount of financial aid offered by a school.
- **Financial Need** = difference between cost of attendance (COA) and expected family contribution (EFC); will vary by college; amount of need determines the aid a student will receive.
- **Institution-Based Aid** = financial assistance offered by individual colleges; also called *institutional aid*.
- **Merit-based Aid** = financial aid that is based on grades, test scores, athletic ability, talents or other criteria (merit), and not income or assets.
- **Need-based Aid** = financial aid that is based on a student or family's income and assets.
- **PIN** = personal identification number from the U.S. Department of Education that serves as your electronic signature on the FAFSA.
- **Scholarship** = money for college that does not need to be repaid; awarded based on grades, test scores, major, heritage, or other criteria, and sometimes, financial need.
- **Student Aid Report (SAR)** = the report that summarizes the information you provided on the FAFSA.

COMPLETING THE FAFSA (from the EdFund Publication *Fund Your Future*)

1. Collect your information

- a. **Your Social Security number.** If you're a dependent student (your parent(s) claim(s) you on their taxes), you'll also need your parents' Social Security numbers.
If your parents don't have Social Security Numbers, enter all zeros when asked on the FAFSA.
- b. **Your Federal Student Aid PIN, and one of your parents' PINs, if you're a dependent student.** Go to www.pin.ed.gov to get your PIN in real time. Your PIN will be used to e-sign your FAFSA, make corrections to your FAFSA, add schools, and more. You can use it each year to apply for federal aid. It's important not to share your PIN with anyone.
- c. **Your financial records.** This includes W-2 forms or other records of money earned, current bank statements, business and investment records, and records of untaxed income (for example, veteran benefits, child support or workers' compensation payments) as well as your parents' 2012 federal tax return (and yours, if you file one).
 - i. **IMPORTANT: Don't wait until you or your parents have filed a tax return to submit the FAFSA.** Instead, get your FAFSA in early using estimated income figures based on last year's return or payroll stubs. You will be required to update your information once your tax returns are filed, but your submission date will not change. The sooner you file your FAFSA, the more options you will have.
- d. **An e-mail address.** If you provide one, you'll receive your FAFSA results sooner.
- e. **Your driver's license number,** if you have one.
- f. **Your Alien Registration number,** if you're not a U.S. citizen.

2. Fill out the FAFSA on the Web Worksheet

- a. The FAFSA on the Web Worksheet lists all the questions in the same order as they will appear on the online FAFSA. You can download one from www.fafsa.gov (search for FAFSA on the Web Worksheet and select the 2013-2014 version) or stop by the College & Career Center to pick up a copy. By filling out this worksheet ahead of time, you'll have all the information you need in front of you when you're ready to complete the FAFSA.

3. Complete the FAFSA online

- a. The simplest way to complete the FAFSA is online at www.fafsa.gov; it's fast, easy, and secure. **IMPORTANT:** Beware of other FAFSA websites ending in *.com* or *.org*—the only official FAFSA site is www.fafsa.gov. ***If you are asked to pay when submitting your FAFSA, it means you used the wrong site.*** The application should be FREE to complete. Here are some tips that will help you successfully file your FAFSA:
 - i. **Schedule an hour.** The FAFSA should take about one hour if you have your completed FAFSA on the Web Worksheet in front of you.
 - ii. **Read all the instructions, work through each step, and review your answers carefully.** Careless errors can delay processing, which could mean missed deadlines and dollars.
 - iii. **Be sure your name matches your name as it appears on your Social Security card.** Using a nickname will delay processing.
 - iv. **Don't have a computer?** Look into using one at school. You can save your FAFSA for up to 45 days at a time, so you don't have to complete it in one sitting.
 - v. **Keep a copy of your FAFSA for your records.** Also keep copies of the financial records you used to complete the FAFSA. Your college may ask to see them.
 - vi. **E-sign your FAFSA** using your Federal Student Aid PIN.

4. Submit any other applications

- a. Some colleges use the FAFSA as well as additional applications, such as the CSS/Financial Aid PROFILE, to award their private financial aid dollars. Unlike the FAFSA, the PROFILE costs money to submit. Ask the financial aid office of each college you're considering what forms are required to apply for financial aid. Also, ask about deadlines and whether a deadline is the *postmark* date or the *received* date.

5. Review your Student Aid Report (SAR)

- a. If you submit your FAFSA online and provide all the required e-signatures and an e-mail address, you'll usually receive your Student Aid Report, or SAR, within 72 hours. If you submit the paper FAFSA, it could take up to two weeks.
 - i. The SAR contains the information you provided on the FAFSA and lists your expected family contribution (EFC), for the school year. Look for this number next to "EFC" at the top of your SAR—there won't be a dollar sign. If there are any numbers after the EFC, even zeros, then your EFC was calculated. If there are no numbers, your SAR is incomplete and you must provide additional information or corrections before your EFC can be calculated. Be sure to review your SAR right away for accuracy and follow the instructions if you need to make corrections.

6. Evaluate your financial aid offers

- a. The financial aid office at each college you list on your FAFSA (that you have been or will be accepted to) will provide you with an evaluation of your eligibility for financial aid if you submitted the required financial aid applications and met the deadlines. If your college asks for additional information, be sure to respond promptly.
- b. Your offer may list your college's annual Cost of Attendance (COA), the amount that will be covered by a mix of grants, work-study, loans, or other aid, and the amount you and your family can contribute. It may also explain the terms and conditions for receiving student aid and the deadline for accepting or declining it.
- c. Your offer will typically vary from college to college, so you may want to wait until you've heard from each one before making a decision—but don't wait so long that you miss deadlines.
- d. Keep in mind that **you don't have to accept your entire student aid package but can pick and choose the aid you want**. If you do decide to decline aid, however, that aid may not be available later if you change your mind. If you're offered a loan, remember that accepting a loan means accepting the responsibility of repaying it.

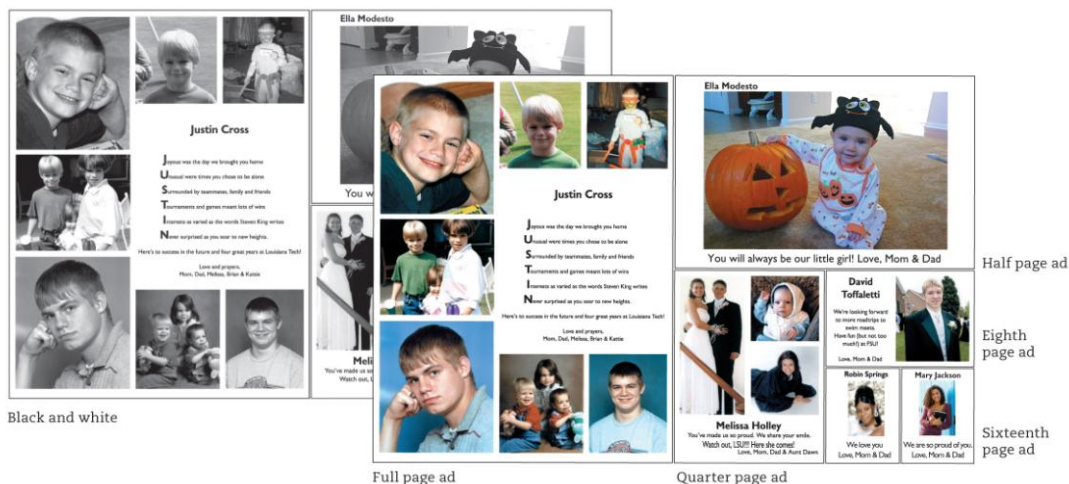

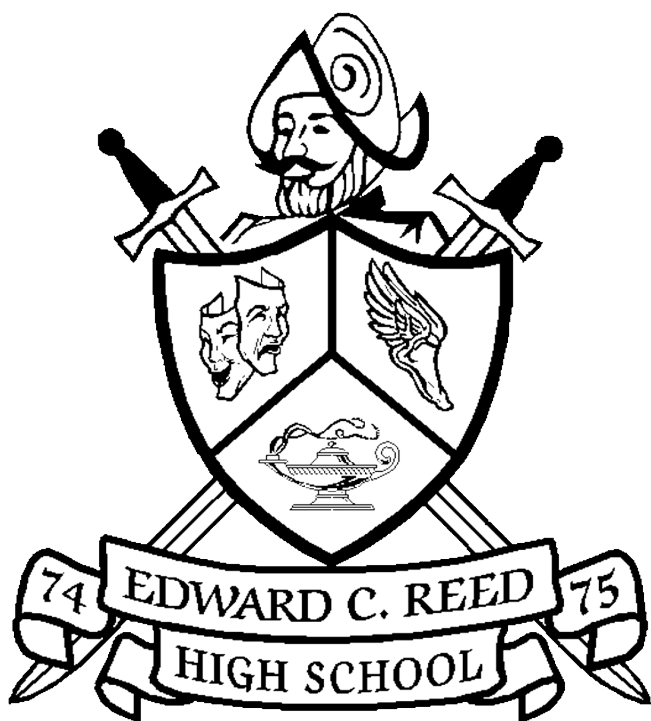
