Letter from the Principal

Dear Parents and Guardians:

With this newsletter, I want to welcome the parents of the Class of 2016. Reed High School publishes a newsletter four times a year and we hope that you will find it informative.

To the parents of seniors, **graduation** is scheduled **Wednesday, June 6, at 7:00 p.m.** at **Reno-Sparks Convention Center**. **Mandatory graduation practice** will be held between **9:30-11:00 a.m.** (doors open at 9:00 a.m.) on the **same day**. Summer Reminders

During the summer you will receive information regarding the start of school for the 2012-2013 school year. Summer **registration** is scheduled for the week of August 13, 14, and 15. Freshmen will attend Raider Mentor day to pick up their ID's and schedules on August 17. Late registration is Monday, August 20. School begins on August 27.

Book Deposit: \$20 book deposit is a one time charge that is returned to the students when they graduate as long as there have been no fines or lost books over their four years high school.

Student Activity Fee: \$25.00 The annual student Activity Fee will enable a student to run for and hold student offices, participate in athletics, student leadership, etc. A paid Activity Fee offers the following **privileges**: free entry to home athletic events, reduced rates to all away athletic events, attend school activities at a reduced rate, and the right to be nominated and elected to Class and Student Leadership offices. The purchase of a Student Activity designation on your child's ID card can save a considerable amount of money considering that each athletic contest: football, volleyball, basketball (boys and girls), soccer (boys and girls), wrestling, baseball, softball, track cost **\$6.00** for student admission.

For 12th Graders:

Seniors and their families are planning for **graduation**. One of the most important things to keep in mind is that your 12th grader must **complete** all of his/her **classes** in order to earn enough credits to graduate. We can't allow our 12th graders to become afflicted with "senioritis" and come up short in any class.

What can we do to **help them**?

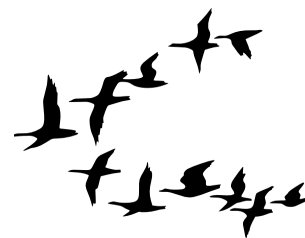
- Parents must continue to check **Infinite Campus** to see your child's grade/missing assignments in any class.
- Check **attendance**. Make sure your child is not taking long lunches with friends, leaving early, or missing classes during any part of the day. If he/she is out sick, call the attendance office to excuse the absences.
- Check to make sure your child has passed all **High School Proficiency Exams** (math, science, reading, writing).
- Check with your child's **counselor** for updates

- Check with the **teachers**. They are all on **e-mail** (usually, the first letter of their first name, followed by their last name, @washoeschools.net). Or call the school: 353-5700

- Check with your **child**. He/she usually knows when things are not going well at school.
- **Proficiency Exam** Scores from the March test should be out by April 17. At that time, we will inform any 12th graders who failed any one of the tests that the next testing opportunity will be April 30 – May 2 (Only Seniors on track to graduate can participate in these tests at this time).
 - * Monday, April 30 Math, morning
 - * Tuesday, May 1 Science, morning
Reading, afternoon
 - * Wednesday, May 2 Writing, morning

For all other students, including incoming 9th graders:

We are currently in the process of finalizing all of our students' course requests for the 2012-2013 school year. Our counselors have been working with our current 9th, 10th, and 11th graders to enter course requests into our computer system. On "Soon To Be a Raider Day" (Friday March 29), we collected all of the course request forms from our 8th (soon to be 9th) graders. 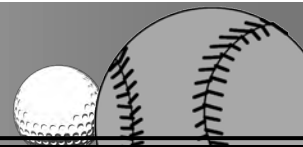

As the days grow longer, our school year grows shorter. Spring sports at the time of this writing are in full swing.

In what has been one of the most successful sports campaigns in Reed history, we are still looking to add more hardware. In **softball**, our Lady Raiders are set to start a new era by opening play on their brand-new home field. Completion is set for April 16th and we will have hoped to play our first "home" game in 26 years there against Damonte Ranch on the 19th of April. If not, we have targeted the 26th against Douglas. Those **Lady Raiders** will hopefully be pushing their league unbeaten streak into double digits at that time as well as they sit on top of the High Desert League and are poised to take the Region and possibly State.

Our **baseball** team is also deep into their schedule and will be making a push into the postseason with a host of games throughout April and May. The big highlight prior to the postseason will take place on the 27th of April when we face off against rival Spanish Springs at Aces Ballpark.

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Wow! Where did the year go? It is already April and there is still so much yet to do.

North Valleys Air Force JROTC "**Panther Challenge**" was exciting. Reed cadets earned Trophies in every category; and all had a great day of competition.

In February and March your cadets learned a new language in class, **SEMASPHORE**. Ask your son or daughter to send you a message using this new language.

This year's **Navy Ball** will be held on Saturday, 4 April, at the Red Hawk Golf course. It is a formal dinner/dance with the men wearing service dress uniforms and the ladies wearing formal dresses. All are excited about this annual dinner/dance. What an exciting way to start the Easter Break.

Major Stephen Tynan, our third instructor, will arrive on 16 April, in time for our **Annual Military Inspection (AMI)**. AMI will be held on Wednesday, 18 April 2012. This is one of the events which determine those NJROTC Units in Area 13 that will earn the Distinguished Unit award. It is a big deal for our students and the command. This is a stressful time for many of our students since it will be their first time to be inspected by someone they do not know.



However, it is also a time of personal growth not offered in any other class.

On the Saturday following the AMI, 21 April, Reed NJROTC will be competing with the other 10 JROTC programs in Washoe County in the **Nevada Army National Guard Olympics**. The Olympics will be held this year at North Valleys High School. Come and watch the competition.

The following week, 25 through 29 April, 51 cadets and 5 chaperones will be taking a field trip to the **San Diego** area. This year they will be staying at Pendleton Marine Base. During this trip they will experience/tour LCAC's, Submarines, surface ships, Marine Aviation, and eat in military cafeterias (fondly called "Chow Halls").

On 5 May, following the San Diego trip our athletic teams will be competing in Fallon Nevada with all the local Navy JROTC units for the much sought after **Northern Nevada Navy Field Meet Trophy**.

On May 18 those juniors that are seeking next year's highest leadership position will have **individual boards** with our principal, Mrs. Mary Vesco, and two other faculty/staff members. This Board will choose next year's Battalion Commander. The results will be known at the NJROTC Awards

Ceremony on Tuesday, 22 May 2012.

The **Awards Ceremony** will be held in the large gymnasium starting at 7:00 PM. All NJROTC cadets are required to be at this event. Many local organizations will be present to award our cadets with certificates, medals, trophies, and other forms of recognition. This is an event you do not want to miss.

The **Spring Platoon Competition** will take place on Friday, 25 May. All 12 platoons will compete for the top 4 places. The cadets in these platoons will earn **OUTSTANDING CADET** ribbons.

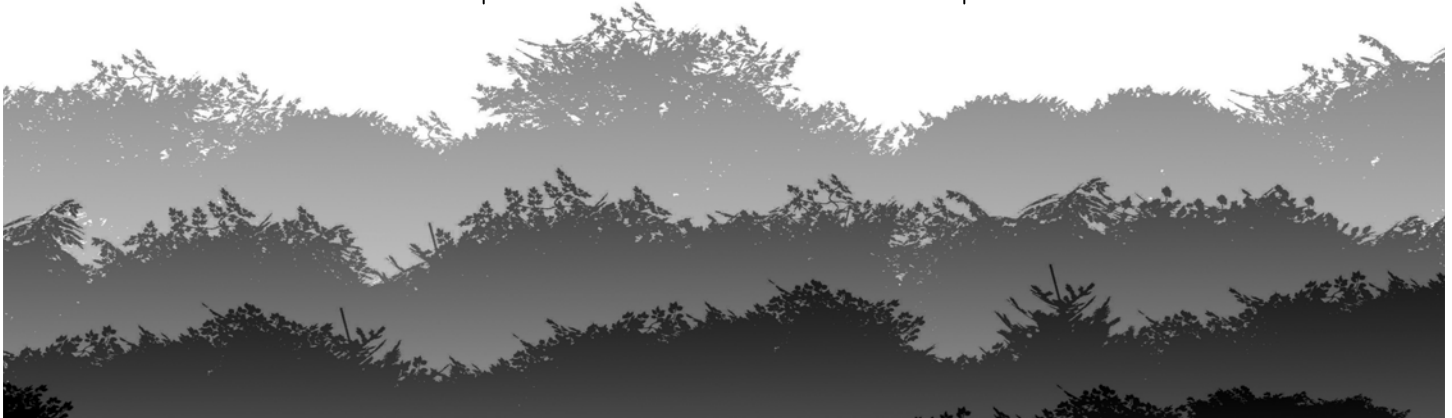
Finals will take place on June 4-6, and **graduation** will take place on 6 June at the Sparks/Reno Convention Center.

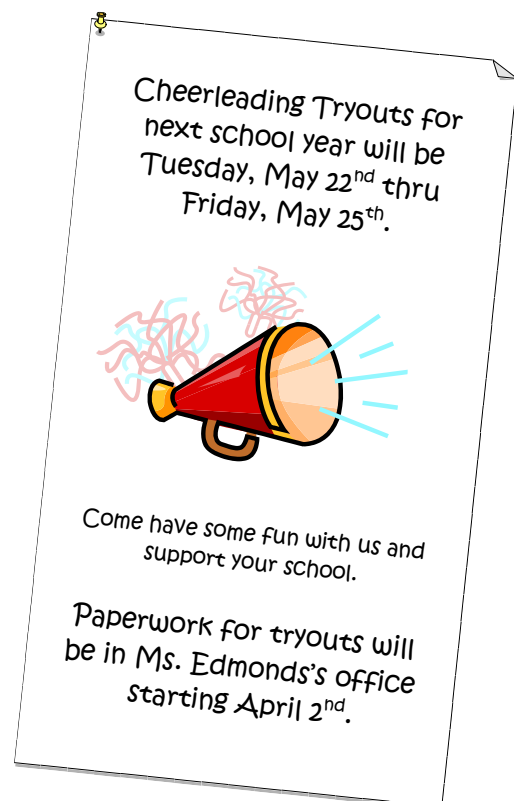

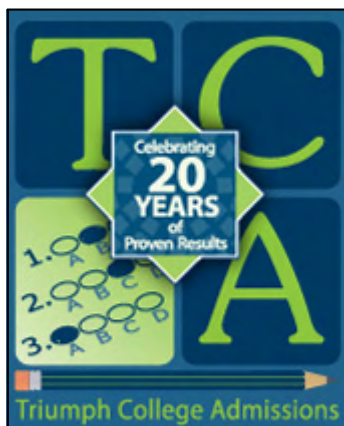

DEAR REED HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETES

THE REED HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETIC DEPARTMENT WOULD LIKE TO WELCOME YOU TO THE 2012-2013 SCHOOL YEAR. THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION IS PROVIDED TO ASSIST YOU IN PREPARING FOR THE FALL SPORTS SEASON:

1. ATHLETIC FORM PACKETS

Student athletes and support group participants are required to complete an Athletic Clearance Packet prior to trying out or participating in any athletic activity. This Athletic Clearance Packet should be turned in at the time of Clearance. **Packets should not be turned into coaches or anyone in the office.** These packets are available at the Reed High School main office and online on the Reed High School WebSite.

2. INSURANCE

It is a Washoe County School District policy that all athletes **must be covered with medical insurance.** If a family insurance plan is not available, students may sign up for school insurance. Please feel free to pick up a copy of this application and brochure at the main office and carefully read for coverage that is available. This insurance is not affiliated with Reed High School.

3. PHYSICALS

All incoming freshmen are required to have a physical. These forms are included in the Clearance Packet. No other forms will be accepted. Physicals performed by Medical Doctors, Doctors of Osteopathic Medicine, Advances Practitioners of Nursing (APN's) and Physician's Assistants are acceptable. Physicals are only good for two years. If you have any questions relative to this matter, please call Cindy McDaniels, the Athletic Secretary.

4. SHOES

At some point during the summer, you will need to purchase a pair of shoes specific for the sport you will be playing. We suggest that you break in these shoes well in advance of the first day of fall sports.

5. STUDENT ACTIVITY CARDS

Student athletes and support group participants are required to pay a student activity fee of \$25.00 prior to participating in extracurricular activities. Athletes will be required to pay this yearly fee in order to participate in any sport.

6. TRAINING SUPPLY FEE/IMPACT FEE

In order to keep our athletes in the best physical condition, a \$5.00 training supply fee will be charged at the time of clearance. This money will be used to offset the rising costs of supplies, which so many of our athletes require. The multi-sport athlete will only pay this fee once during the year. We are also instituting a \$5.00 Impact Concussion Management Program fee this year for all sports.

7. TRANSPORTATION FEE

A \$25.00 fee will be assessed at the time of clearance to cover traveling costs.

8. GRADE CHECKS

Grades for Reed High School students will be checked during the clearance process. Fall Sports athletes second semester grades (June 2012) will be used. Students **do not** need to bring their report cards. **Incoming Freshmen will no longer need to present their report cards. A first semester ninth grade student will be eligible for athletic competition and follow all other NIAA eligibility guidelines.**

READ THE FOLLOWING CAREFULLY BEFORE SIGNING AND DATING THIS APPLICATION

Screening: For the safety of students, all prospective volunteers will be asked to complete an Adult School Volunteer Application and provide a photo I.D. (international ID's are accepted). All prospective volunteers will be given a "Background Check" check pursuant to NRS 179D. Additionally, the District, in its discretion and without a statement of reason, may require a complete criminal history check on any volunteer at any time. In programs where a volunteer is an Overnight Chaperone, may work alone for extended periods of time with a student or by request from the principal, fingerprinting and a full state and federal background check are required. If fingerprinting is required, the school district will cover these costs. All fingerprinting must be authorized.

Confidentiality: What you hear and observe about students, families, and staff while volunteering in a school is **confidential**. Repeating a seemingly harmless comment can lead to misunderstandings and hurt feelings. For schools to provide the best environment for learning, everyone's privacy must be respected.

Liability: The Washoe County School District is proud to provide liability coverage and an accident policy for its volunteers, which will provide up to \$1,500 after any other valid and collectable insurance. In order to have this protection, **all volunteers must sign in on the school's volunteer / visitor sign in sheet** (in every school office) every time they volunteer. Volunteers are not covered by Workers' Compensation. Parents are discouraged from bringing younger children to school, but the final decision rests with each school principal/authority.

Child neglect and abuse reporting: School volunteers are obligated under mandatory child reporting laws to report any suspected child neglect or abuse. If you suspect child abuse, immediately contact the school principal or school counselor.

Supervision: Volunteers perform under the direction and supervision of school personnel. Volunteers should know and follow school policies and rules. The District, in its discretion and without a statement of reasons, may suspend any volunteer from further volunteer activities pending any background check. No statement by the District establishes a property right to perform volunteer work.

Communication: If you are unable to make it to school when you are expected, please call the school and leave a message. Similarly, school staff will contact you if your time is cancelled or changed for any unforeseen reason. You may contact the WCSD Volunteer Services Office at 775-851-5655, or email llightfoot@washoe.k12.nv.us with questions or for assistance.

Student / Volunteer relationships: Volunteers function in a position of trust and Washoe County School District does not extend that volunteer / student trust relationship outside of the supervised school environment. It is the responsibility of the volunteer to notify the site administrator immediately if he/she becomes involved with a student / family outside the WCSD environment.

Since its founding in 1995, United Federal Credit Union's Reed High branch has given students a unique opportunity to gain job skills, money handling experience, and on-the-job training. Students work as tellers during assigned class periods, performing real financial transactions for fellow students, teachers, and staff.

The student teller program began humbly, with four or five students per class. Over time, however, the program has become popular with Reed students. In recent years, up to thirty students have applied for

the eleven positions offered each year.

Some effort is required to gain entry into the program, according to Kim Prina, the branch advisor.

“Students have to fill out an application and go through an interview process. If they're selected, they commit to attending training sessions during the summer,” Prina said.

The summer sessions are paid, but once school starts, it's all about the learning. The real lessons, though, are often about much more than job skills and financial knowledge:

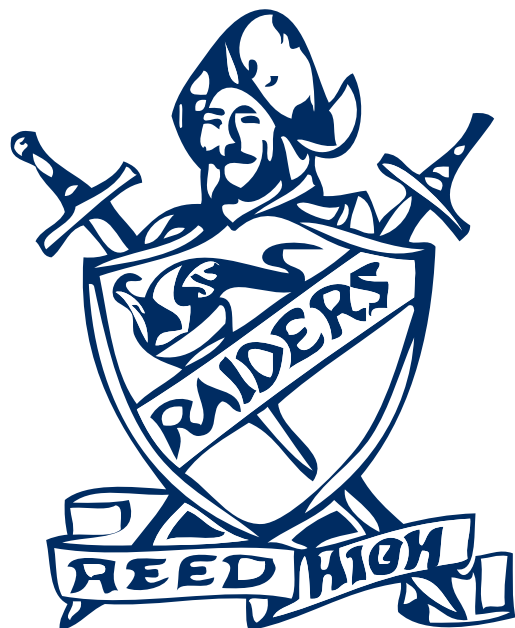
“Sometimes the student who starts out as the quietest and most reserved leaves as the most outgoing person. The credit union gives them a group where they can learn people skills,” Prina said.

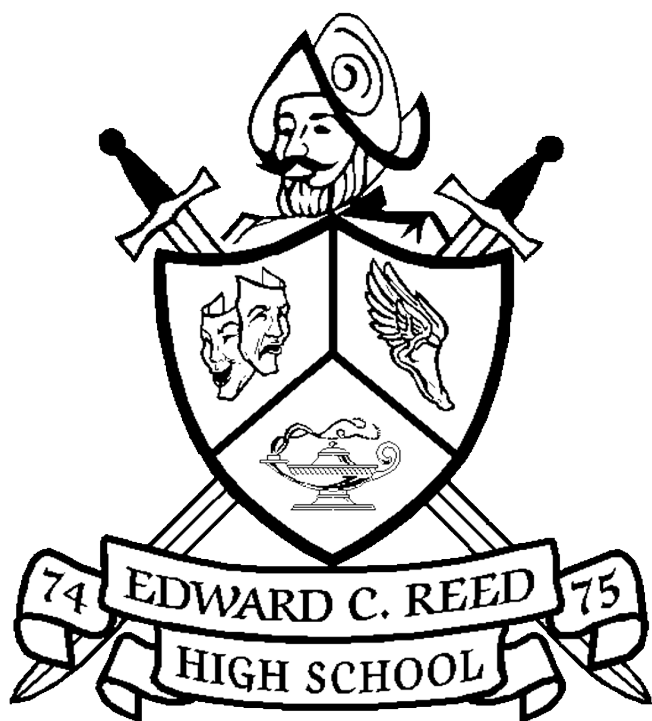
