Letter from the Principal

Dear Parents and Guardians:

With this newsletter, I want to welcome the parents and students of the Class of 2017. Reed High School publishes a newsletter four times a year and we hope that you will find it informative. In the 2013-14 school year, we will e-publish the newsletter on our web-site with a link from Infinite Campus and as well as e-mailing it to all parents who provide their e-mail address. If you still choose to read a hard copy, please inform us and we will continue to mail it to your home.

To the parents of seniors, Graduation is scheduled Thursday, June 6, at 12:00 noon at Lawlor Events Center. Graduation practice, which is mandatory, will be held at 10:00-11:30 a.m. (doors open at 9:30 a.m.) on Thursday, June 6, at Lawlor Events Center. Since the time is so short between practice and graduation, Reed High School will serve a light lunch for our gradu-We will be graduating 458 ates at Lawlor. seniors. I am proud to announce that the co-Valedictorians for the class of 2013 are Eduardo Martinez Medina and Matthew Smith and the Salutatorian is Cody Foreman. The Reed High School Community is extremely proud of their wonderful academic achievements. Please refer to Reed High School's website under graduation link for more information.

One of the responsibilities of a high school is to continue to examine and re-examine our policies and procedures. When the Reed High School faculty and administration saw our state Report Card where we received a rating of 3 Stars out of 5 Stars, we were needless to say disappointed. Our dedicated staff spent a number of Professional Learning Community sessions (PLC released times on Wednesdays) discussing strategies to improve our rating. We examine the Report Card to see where we needed to improve our rating but more importantly, to offer your child the best education possible.

We examined the Points Earned verses the Points Possible. Areas of concern focused on

- Graduation Rate Reed HS scored 77% we earned 15 out of 18 points which is -3 points
- Credit Attainment % of 9th & 10th graders with Sufficient Credits to be on Track to Graduation/Reed scored 86% -we earned 5 out of 8 points which is -3
- % completing 1 or more AP/IB/Dual Credit Courses by Graduation – Reed HS scored 46% -we earned 2 out of 5 points which is -3
- % of graduates passing at least one AP/ IB Exam by graduation – Reed HS scored 19% -we earned 2 out of 5 points which is -3
- 5. % of graduates earning an Advanced Diploma (minimum of 24 credits, 3.25 GPA, 4 years of math with Algebra 2 + one or more higher level math classes, 3 years of science with two or more from biology, chemistry, and/or physics) or Honors Diploma (minimum of 24 credits, 20 required credits plus 4 elective classes including at least eight honor level classes, passed all sections of the HSPE, 3.40 GPA, 4 years English and Math, 3 vears Science, 3 years Social Studies, 2 credits of PE, 1 credit of Arts/Hum, 1 credit Computer Literacy, 1/2 credit of Health, 2 credits of World Language and 4 elective credits) - Reed HS scored 38% -



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we earned 6 out of 10 points which is -4

Other areas where we lost points were

- % Agreement on student engagement items on Student Climate Survey, Reed HS scored 49% -we earned 3 out of 5 points which is -2
- % of students with a (nonemployee) parent logging into Infinite Campus on their behalf, Reed HS scored 50%we earned 3 out of 5 points which is -2

We examined the scores of the other high schools in Washoe County to determine what changes may be needed to assist us in raising our Report Card scores but more importantly help Reed HS to prepare our students to be College and Career ready. One suggestion was to move to a seven period day which would give our students more opportunities to take Advanced Placement and Honor classes, elective classes, intervention classes such as Plato and A+, Advanced Placement study sessions, and remediation for core classes which must be passed for graduation.

The faculty and administration took over four weeks to discuss the advantages of a **seven period day**, retaining our current block schedule which is essentially six periods plus Access class which is 40 minutes long but does not constitute a ½ credit class. (Access/Enrichment class was mandated approximately 10 years ago as a means to offer a "transition period for our 9th graders entering high school life.") Brandon Bringhurst, Assistant Principal, and Sara Jones, English teacher and WEA representive, oversaw the voting process whch included 1. Do we retain our current block schedule which included 6-period plus Access period or 2. Do we transition to a 7period day? It was voted to transition to a 7-period day. Next, the faculty was asked to vote on 1. Do we transition to a traditional 7 period day which is currently used by Reno HS and will be used at McQueen High School in 2013-14 or 2. Do we continue with our current schedule and increase Access to 49 minutes therefore having four classes per day on a rotating ABC schedule and Access meeting daily. The faculty and administration vote favored a traditional seven (7) period day.

I asked the faculty to provide me with some quotes as to why this change "is the best educational setting for the students." Here are some of their comments: more choices for students, more opportunities for us to align schedules with individual needs. room in their schedules for electives, more transitions are more in line with teenage attention span, teachers get to see every student every day, classes go in the same order every day; less confusion, while the class periods will be shorter, I believe being able to see my students every day is really going to make an impact on retention of material, tests given to common classes will always be the same day, so I will not have one class that has to take the exam on one day and the other class gets an extra day to study.

The Administrative Team feels that a 7 credit schedule addressed the

1. Issue of Reed students lagging behind in AP classes and % of students being successful on AP tests and 2. The need to grow our graduation rate. We feel a 7 credit schedule addresses these issues in a variety of ways: AP Courses-should students choose to do so, they will be able to take more AP classes. Reed HS added AP Psychology and AP Micro and Macro Economics in the 2012-13 school year and have added AP Art History, AP Theory of Music, AP Spanish Lit, AP Spanish Language, AP English Language, AP English Lit and AP Human Geography for the 2013-14 school year. We plan to offer "AP Support" classes for students who may need extra support in order to be more successful on the test; more students will be able to graduate with honors and advanced diplomas as a result of extra opportunities. With 7 credits students may be able to participate in a wider range of electives such as choir, art, band, NJROTC, and foods still having time in their schedule for honors and AP courses and other graduation require-Interventions and credit ments. recovery will assist in growing our graduation rate. With the additional credits we will be able to get students into needed interventions (extra Math, English, Science, and Social Studies) without jeopardizing their ability to earn needed graduation credits.

The **schedule** is as follows

1 st Period-	7:45-8:36

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You will note that lunch continues to be 40 minutes long; that is the reason school must begin at 7:45 a.m. and school ends at 2:35 p.m.

We have included in this newsletter a copy of the 2013-2014 school calendar. Please note that school begins on Monday, August 12, and ends on June 13. Fall Break runs from October 14-18, Winter Break runs from December 23 to January 10, Spring Break runs from March 31- April 11. The first semester ends on December 19.

As we approach the upcoming school year, I wanted to share with our parents Reed High School's Mission and Belief statements adapted as part of our Northwest Association of Accredited Schools as part of our six year accreditation process.

Please know that we will work tirelessly to achieve our mission and goals but that equation will not factor without the support, involvement and commitment of our parents. In the 2013-2014 school year we will be undertaking a new accreditation process called **AdvancED** which is replacing the Northwest Association of Accredited Schools. Since we are a school community, our accreditation team will be seeking volunteers for our committees and your valuable input.

Times are financially difficult for many families and very difficult for other families. If your family is already on **Free & Reduced** status, please remember to inform the bookkeeper, Jackie Fleming, of your status. In this way, she can inform you of what fees may be reduced or waived. Fee reduction for Advanced Placement

tests may also be reduced or waived if a student is on Free & Reduced status. If your financial status changes over the summer, please contact Reed's bookkeeper, registrar, or the cafeteria manager for a Free & Reduced lunch eligibility form.

Yearbook distribution for seniors will be held on Thursday, May 23 from 2:30-3:30 p.m. in the cafeteria. The general yearbook distribution for underclass students will be held Wednesday, May 29, from 1:45-2:30 p.m. in the cafeteria.

As you know, we had a death in the Reed HS family, Kelly Harris, a very popular English teacher. Summer Reminders

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ATTENDANCE

The Washoe County School District attendance policy states that all students are required to attend school for a minimum of 90% of the scheduled classes in order to receive credit. The policy applies even if the student is passing their classes academically. In other words, it is possible to pass a class academically and still fail the course due to lack of attendance.



Fortunately, not all of the absences count against students. For instance, if your child misses school for a medical reason (MED), a doctor excused day (EMD), a school business day (SCH), or a circumstantial day (CIR) then those days are not counted into the total. Therefore, at Reed High School, 90% attendance translates to (6) unverified absences per semester.

The absence types that do count toward the six unverified are absent unknown (AUK), domestic (DOM), truant (TRU) and confirmed truant (CT). If your child has accumulated seven or more absences in any combination of these absence types, please contact the attendance office as soon as possible. Also, if your child does miss school, please make sure you send a note or make a phone call into the attendance office (325-8337) within three days of the absence.

TARDIES

Punctuality makes for fewer interruptions to learning and is one of the traits employers value most. We have worked diligently to reward punctuality and discourage tardiness this year at Reed High School.

There are many students who are rarely or never late. These students can look forward to receiving H.O.T. Passes (as long as they don't have unexcused absences), which can be used to

get out of detention or turned in at the end of the year for a chance at raffle prizes. There are those few, however, who are frequently or chronically tardy to school and class, which can be disruptive to the teaching and learning environment already taking place.

We encourage you to review your child's attendance on Infinite Campus. Tardies are indicated by UMI (Unexcused Missed Instruction). The vast majority of tardies occur in the morning. If a problem is apparent, please impress upon your child the importance of punctuality and help him or her make a plan for arriving to school and class on time.





ATHLETIC INFORMATION APRIL 2013

DEAR REED HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETES

THE REED HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETIC DEPARTMENT WOULD LIKE TO WELCOME YOU TO THE 2013-2014 SCHOOL YEAR. THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION IS PROVIDED TO ASSIST YOU IN PREPARING FOR THE FALL SPORTS SEASON:

1. ATHLETIC FORM PACKETS

Student athletes and support group participants are required to complete an Athletic Clearance Packet prior to trying out or participating in any athletic activity. This Athletic Clearance Packet should be turned in at the time of Clearance. **Packets should not be turned into coaches or anyone in the office**. These packets are available at the Reed High School main office and online on the Reed High School WebSite. (when available)

2. INSURANCE

It is a Washoe County School District policy that all athletes **must be covered with medical insurance.** If a family insurance plan is not available, students may sign up for school insurance. Please feel free to pick up a copy of this application and brochure at the main office and carefully read for coverage that is available. This insurance is not affiliated with Reed High School.

3. PHYSICALS

All incoming freshmen are required to have a physical. These forms are included in the Clearance Packet. No other forms will be accepted. Physicals performed by Medical Doctors, Doctors of Osteopathic Medicine, Advances Practitioners of Nursing (APN's) and Physician's Assistants are acceptable. Physicals are only good for two years. If you have any questions relative to this matter, please call Cindy McDaniels, the Athletic Coordinator.

4. SHOES

At some point during the summer, you will need to purchase a pair of shoes specific for the sport you will be playing. We suggest that you break in these shoes well in advance of the first day of fall sports.

5. STUDENT ACTIVITY CARDS

Student athletes and support group participants are required to pay a student activity fee of \$25.00 prior to participating in extracurricular activities. Athletes will be required to pay this yearly fee in order to participate in any sport.

6. TRAINING SUPPLY FEE/IMPACT FEE

In order to keep our athletes in the best physical condition, a \$5.00 training supply fee will be charged at the time of clearance. This money will be used to offset the rising costs of supplies, which so many of our athletes require. The multi-sport athlete will only pay this fee once during the year. We are also instituting a \$5.00 Impact Concussion Management Program fee this year for all sports.

7. TRANSPORTATION FEE

A \$25.00 fee will be assessed at the time of clearance to cover traveling costs.

8. GRADE CHECKS

Grades for Reed High School students will be checked during the clearance process. Fall Sports athletes second semester grades (June 2013) will be used. Students **do not** need to bring their report cards. **Incoming Freshmen will no longer need to present their report cards.** A first semester ninth grade student will be eligible for athletic competition and follow all other NIAA eligibility guidelines.




